CURRICULUM:

The academic program at the MDN Future School is designed to meet the needs of young children. Childhood is a period of rapid growth and children seek out the stimuli, they need to nourish their developing mental abilities. Young children need a sound base of experiences that will be essential for later learning, a strong sense of self-esteem and excitement & curiosity for learning. It is during this time that children develop higher order thinking skills such as problem solving, critical thinking, creative thinking, societal thinking, reflecting thinking etc. Our curriculum is planned and developed to create such experiences for our students.

ACADEMICS:

A strong academic plan is put in place for the current academic year. A teaching plan based on Outcome based learning was prepared and applied so as to get best results in the upcoming year. Where all exam schedule of CBSE will come back to its normal, a plan for completion of syllabus, weekly tests, Examinations, Pre-boards, Extra Classes for extra practice are planned for the board classes. Remedial classes are conducted for doubt clearing.

In the current year the child's academics performance is measured in a series of Weekly Tests, Periodic Tests, Half-Yearly Exam and Annual Exam. At MDN Future School all examinations are conducted in a board format where question papers are designed in such a way that the child is facing a new challenge on his own without any help from his teachers.

Students of class 1 to 10 participated in All India Talent Examination in Mathematics, Science, English, Social Science, General Knowledge and IT organized by Science Olympiad foundation of different streams.

BOARD EXAM PREPARATION AND RESULTS:

Along with regular teaching-learning process and syllabus completion, class 10 students were continuously evaluated through Weekly Tests, Chapter wise Tests, Periodic Tests, 2 Pre-Boards etc. Each subject teacher got a charge 4 student to look after. These teachers took follow-up of those kids: book completion, subject wise weaknesses, academics problems and chapter wise queries. Extra classes and remedial classes proved very helpful in improving the academic results class 10.
